1. Complete, print out, and submit the International Student Application below.
[If you have permanent residence status, do not use this application form. Please go to Apply.wcu.edu and choose the Freshman or Transfer application.]
2. Pay the non-refundable application fee of \$45 (US funds ONLY). You may make payment with either a cashier's check or a Money Order, drawn from a United States banking institution, made out to Western Carolina University. Please make sure that the full name of the person applying appears on the check.
3. Download, print, and complete the [Certification of Finances form](#) which certifies that you have adequate financial support during your stay in the United States. Be sure to obtain all the signatures required on the form.
4. Download, print, and complete the [Immunization and Health Insurance form](#) and obtain necessary signatures from your physician or health clinic. All students must purchase and enroll in the health insurance plan offered by Western Carolina University.
5. If you are not currently in the United States, submit a photocopy of the identification page of your passport.

If you are currently in the United States, submit:

- photocopy of the visa page in your passport **and**
- photocopy of your I-20 and I-94 card (front and back)

7. Have official copies **in English** of your academic records or transcripts from secondary and postsecondary institutions sent to Western Carolina University at the above address. 8. Have official TOEFL **or** SAT test scores sent directly to Western Carolina University at the above address. Student copies will not be accepted as official. If English is your native language, the SAT is required. The Western Carolina University code for TOEFL and SAT is 5897.
